

SHIP TO SHORE RIGHTS PROJECT SOUTH-EAST ASIA

A regional programme on labour migration in the fishing sector

Period: 1 August 2020 – 31 July 2024 (47 months)



























The Joint Project shall be carried out in collaboration with IOM and UNDP in South-East Asia: Laos, Thailand, Cambodia, Myanmar (with limitation of interaction due to the current situation in Myanmar), the Philippines, Laos, Viet Nam and Indonesia. The JP is a multi-year and multi-country action implemented with an asymmetric approach, with the following objectives:

To strengthen regulatory framework related to labour migration and labour standards



To protect labour rights and promote a safe and secure environment, in particular for all migrant workers



To empower migrant workers, their families, organizations and communities to exercise their rights

Key knowledge exchange on seafood good labour practices between Indonesian association of seafood processing sector (Indonesian Pole and Line and Handline Fisheries Association - AP2HI) and the Thai association of seafood processing sector



Stronger and more empowered trade union working in seafood processing sector (Trade Union Federation of Food, Beverage, Tourism, Restaurant, Hotel And Tobacco - KAMIPARHO)



A Harmonization Team established by the Indonesian Coordinating Ministry of Maritime Affairs and Investment to work on harmonizing laws and regulations in Indonesia fishing sector



Fair Seas Labour Conference with 85 participants from 8 countries with priorities identified



A Joint Inspection Decree of Central Java Province for the labour inspection onboard fishing vessels



ASEAN Declaration on the Placement and Protection of Migrant Fishers adopted with Ship to Shore Rights South-East Asia (S2SR) support.



The establishment of the Migrant Resource Center (MRC) specific for Indonesian Migrant Fishers in Tegal Central Java Province, the first of its kind in Tegal, in collaboration with the Indonesian Migrant Workers Trade Union (SBMI).
