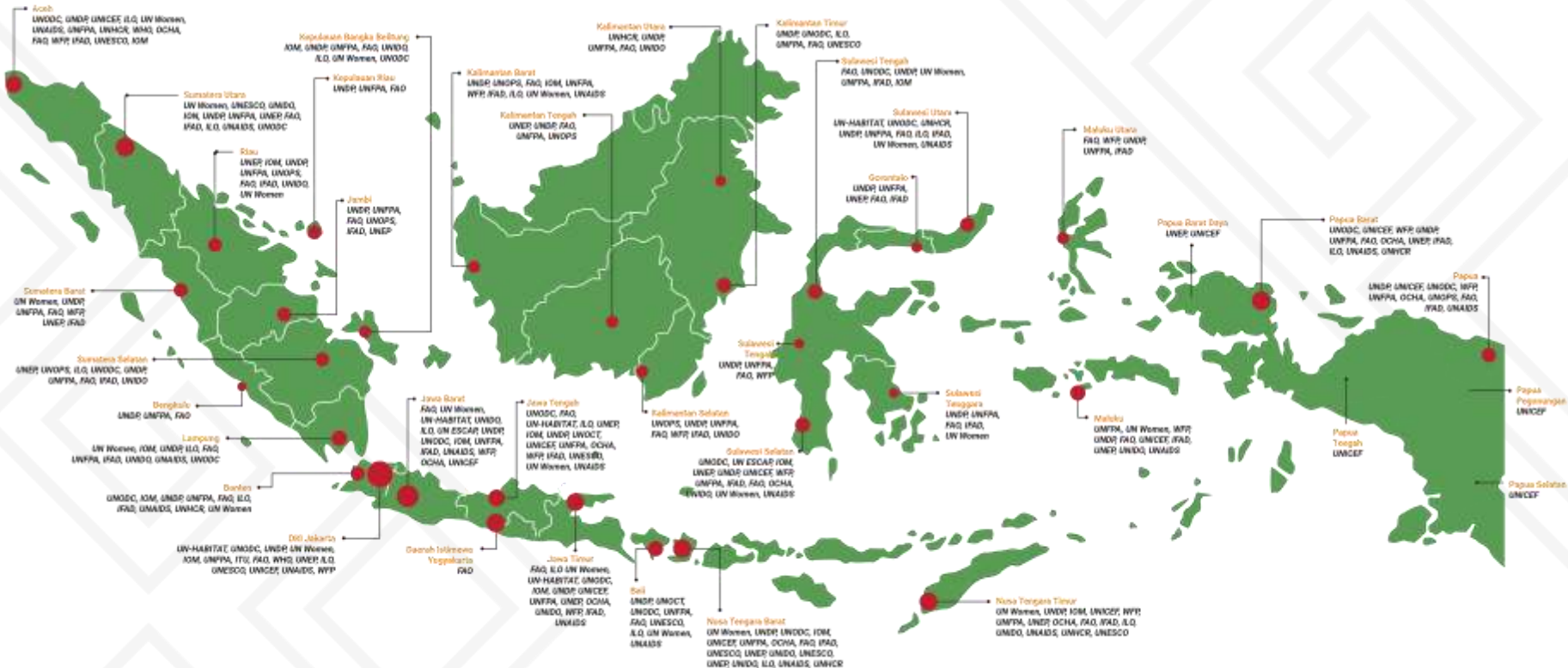

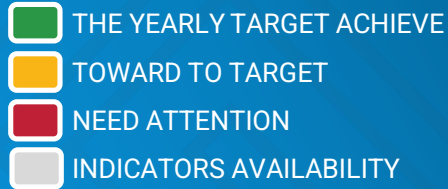
Geographic Outreach - 123 Districts

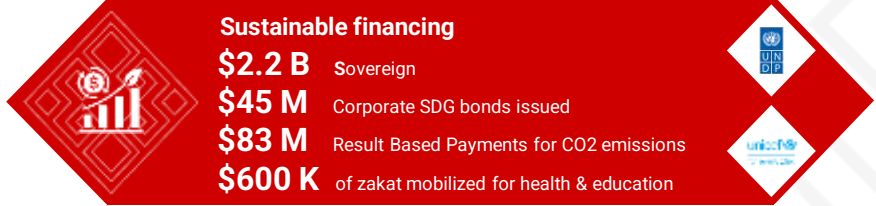
